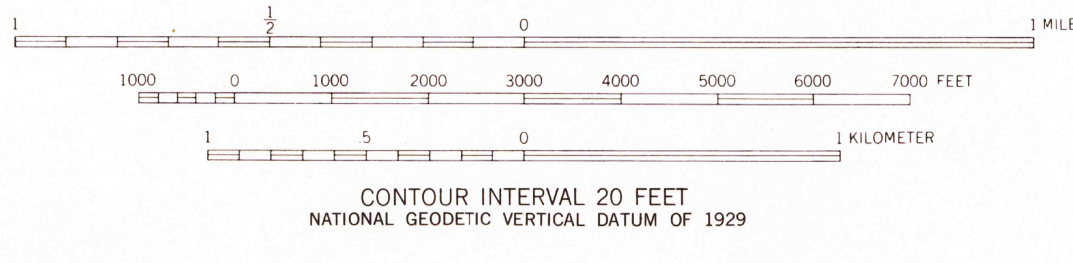
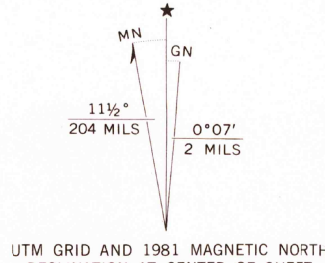
PENNINGTON QUADRANGLE
