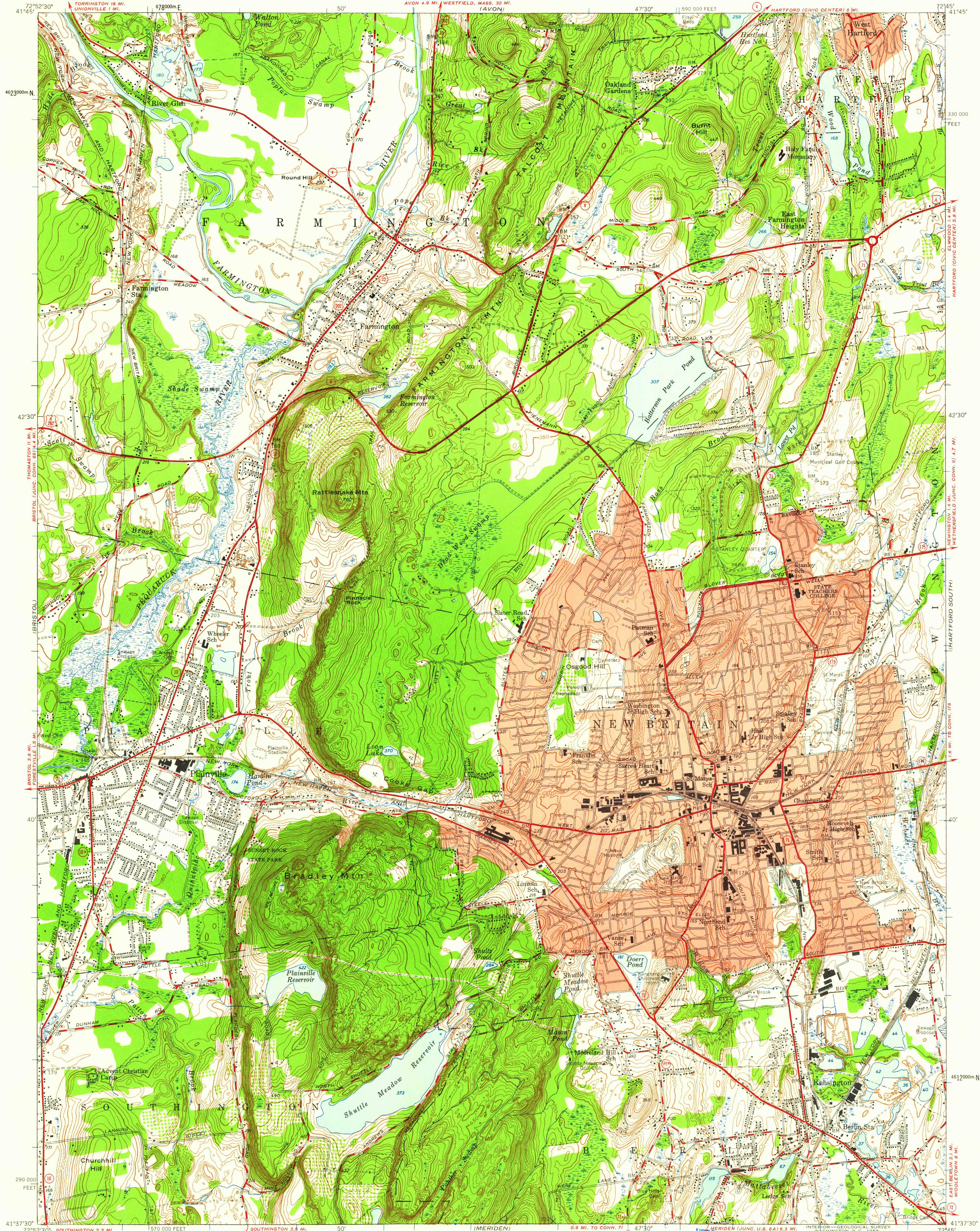

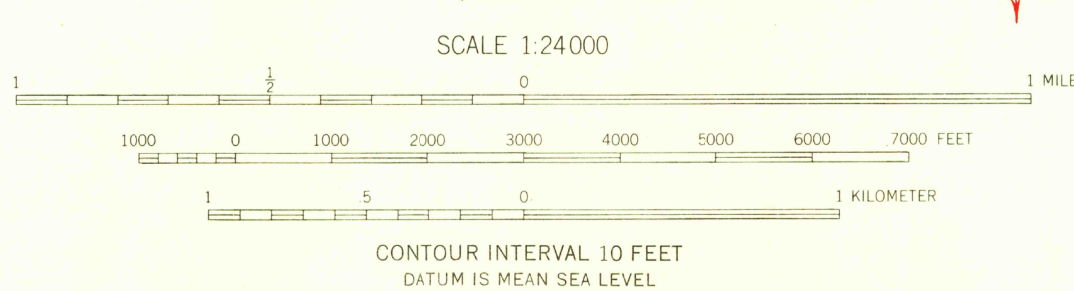

zone 18, shown in blue

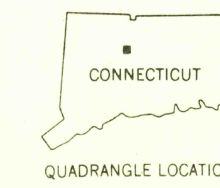
TRUE NORTH
