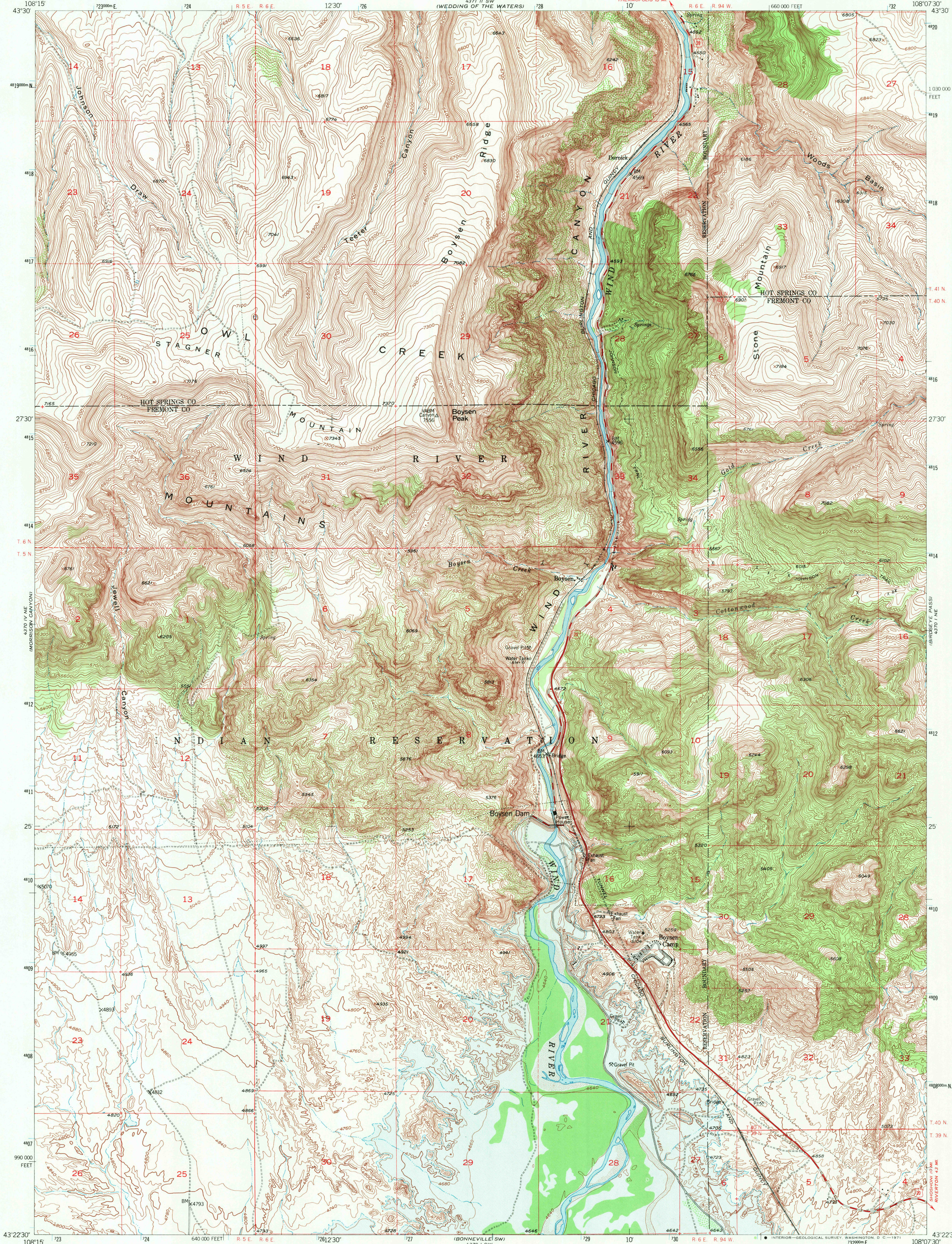

Dashed land lines indicate approximate locations

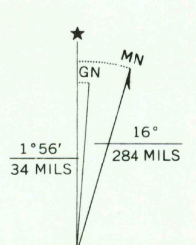
R. 5 E. and R. 6 E. based on Wind River Meridian

R. 94 W. based on 6th Principal Meridian

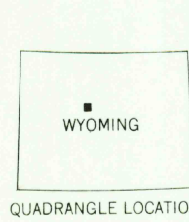
