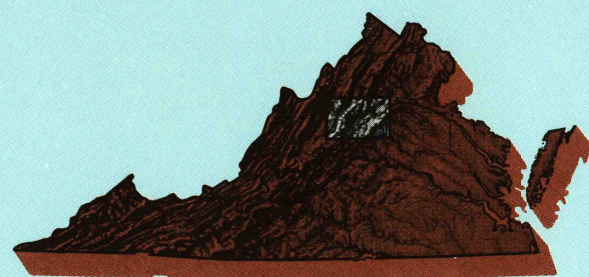

To place on the predicted North American Datum 1983 move the projection lines 9 meters south and 23 meters west. There may be private inholdings within the boundaries of the National or State reservations shown on this map.

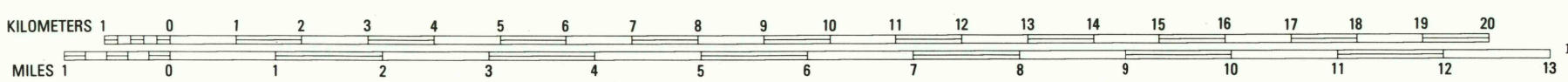
