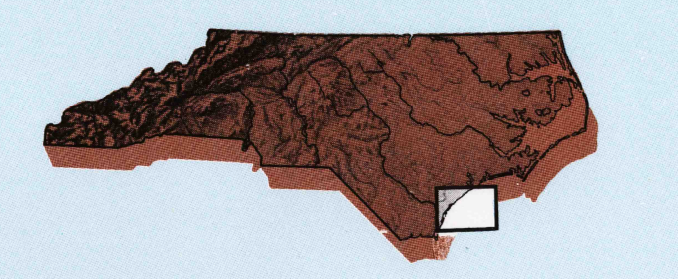


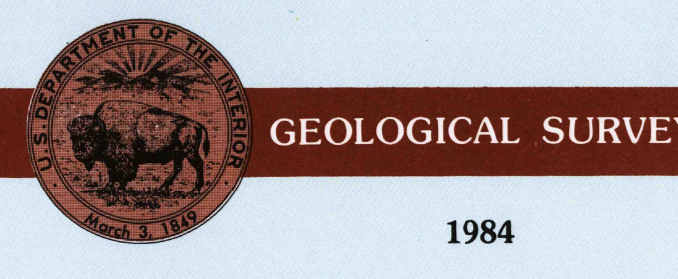
Wilmington NORTH CAROLINA
