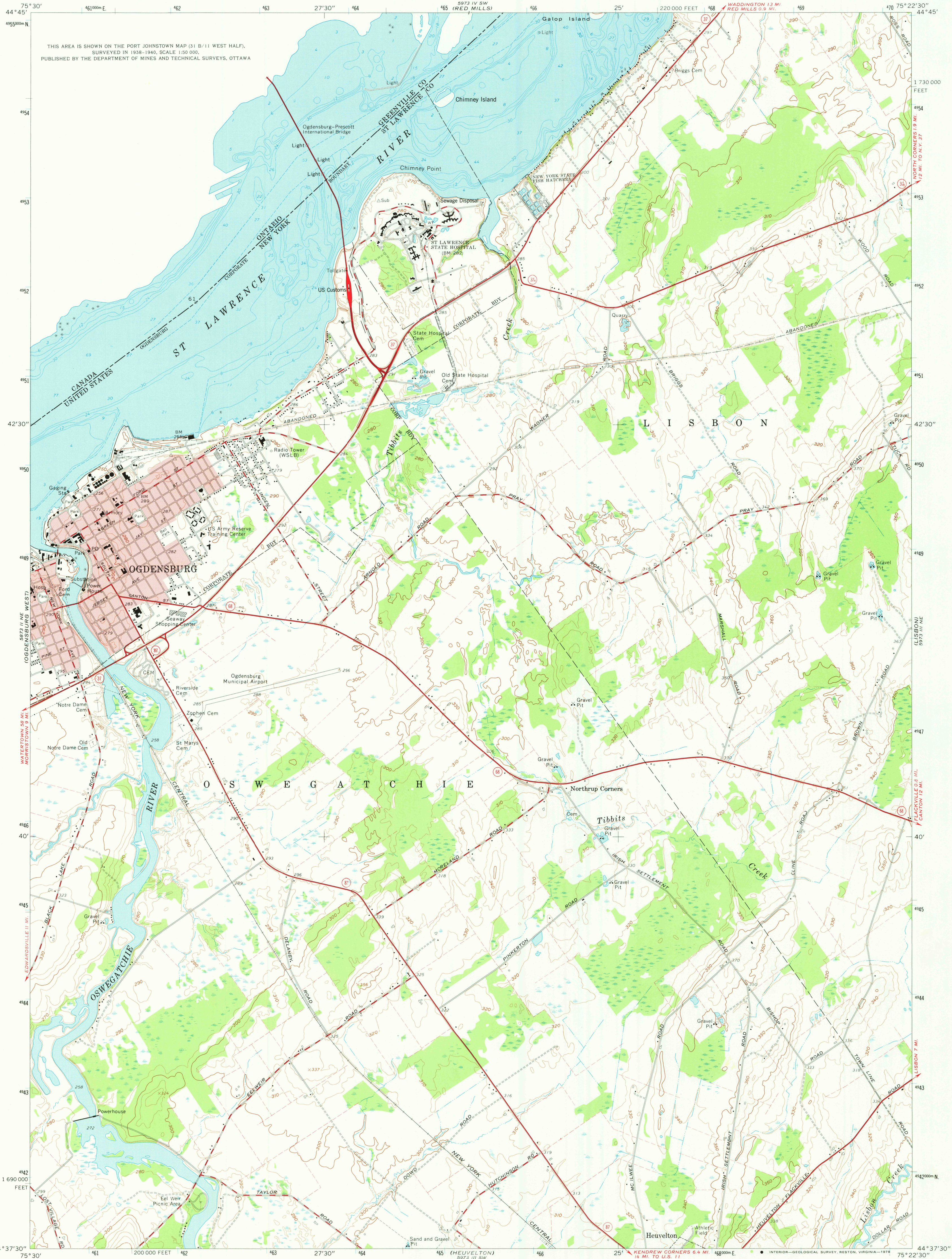




THIS AREA IS SHOWN ON THE PORT JOHNSTOWN MAP (31 B/11 WEST HALF),

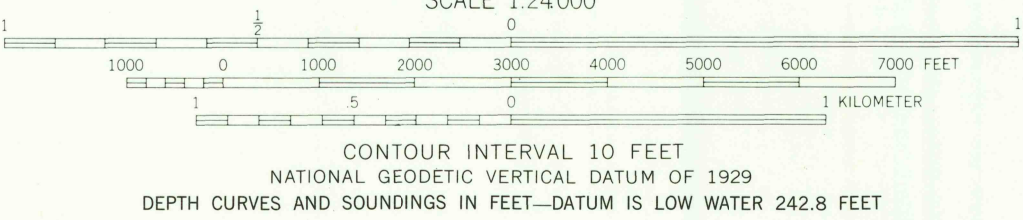
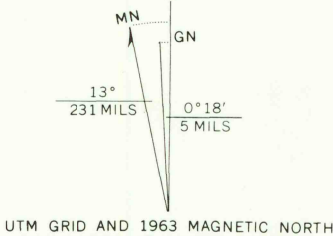
