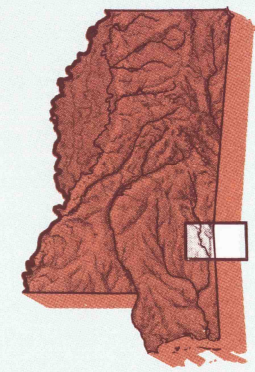

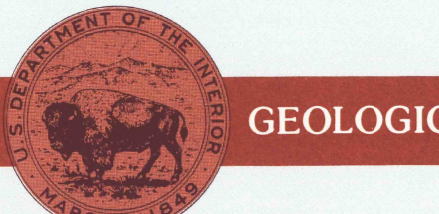
MISSISSIPPI-ALABAMA
