


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

10,000-foot grid based on Michigan coordinate system,
north zone
1000-meter Universal Transverse Mercator grid ticks,
zone 16, shown in blue
To place on the predicted North American Datum 1983,
move the projection lines 7 meters north and
7 meters east as shown by dashed corner ticks
Red tint indicates areas in which only landmark buildings are shown
